PLAN OF ACTIVITIES

Program activities will begin at **9.30am on Monday September 4th** and end at **5.30pm on Tuesday September 5th**.

The Oxford program consists of a series of **closed-door seminars** held by **international extradition experts** - including renowned **British Solicitors and Barristers** - over the course of two days (**training hours: 12**). A **social dinner in the College Hall** will be hosted on Monday night. Seminars will be conducted through an innovative **learning-by-doing** style, which encourages group discussions and simulations of extradition and EAW proceedings. Seminars will also include the **sharing of experiences**, the viewing of **mini-videos** and the **review of famous extradition cases**.

What you will bring home

- in-depth knowledge of extradition and EAW law;
- review of recent developments in extradition case-law (ECJ, ECHR and selected domestic Supreme Courts);
- a set of skills for extradition cases;
- a set of “lines of argument” for extradition cases;
- useful extradition material, including cases, literature and samples of authentic EAWs;
- a network of colleagues expert in extradition-related matters.

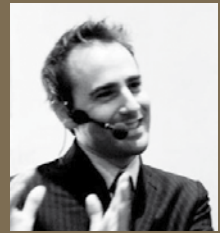

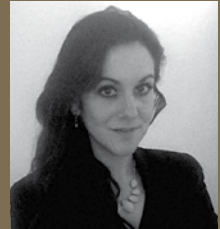
